ORDER

Oral argument in this case is scheduled for 9 a.m. on Thursday, May 9, 2019. The State will argue first because it bears the burden of establishing constitutional compliance. *Gannon v. State*, 305 Kan. 850, 856, 390 P.3d 461 (2017). The State is granted a total of 30 minutes for oral arguments. It may reserve a portion of its time for rebuttal. See Supreme Court Rule 7.01(e)(3) (2019 Kan. S. Ct. R. 42) (reserving rebuttal time). Appellees are also granted 30 minutes for oral argument and will argue after the State concludes its main argument.

Not later than May 2, 2019, the parties are ordered to file written notice of who will be arguing their cause and, if applicable, how they will split their time.
