<u>Judicial Ethics Opinion JE 103</u>

APPEL ATE COLUMN

FACTS:

An attorney in private practice represented a young man who entered a guilty plea to a charge of burglary. Five years later, the young man is seeking expungement and asks his former attorney to provide a letter of recommendation. The former attorney is now a judge.

QUESTION:

May the judge write a letter of recommendation for the former client, knowing that the letter will be submitted to another judge who is considering expungement?

ANSWER:

No. A judge shall not lend the prestige of judicial office to advance the private interests of others, or testify voluntarily as a character witness. Canon 2(B), 1999 Kan. Ct. R. Annot. 466.
