<u>**Iudicial Ethics Opinion JE-48**</u>

April 27, 1994

Question:

May a sitting judge pose in judicial attire in his or her courtroom for a professional photograper who intends to use the photographs so taken in a portfolio demonstrating his work. This will be circulated to various advertising agencies. The judge would receive no compensation, does not know the photographer, and does not anticipate that the photographer will ever be a litigant in the judge's court.

Answer:

We believe the judge's proposed conduct is prohibited by Canon 2B, which provides in pertinent part:

"A judge . . . should not lend the prestige of his office to advance the private interests of others . . ."
